I: GENERAL

COATES, R. (University of Sussex): (a) theoretical work on the meaning of proper names and on that of definite referring expressions with unique denotata; (b) an article, 'Proper names and linguistic change', for the *Pergamon Encyclopaedia of Language and Linguistics*.

KENYON, D. (Manchester Centre for Anglo-Saxon Studies): a book, *The Origins of Lancashire*, commissioned by Manchester University Press.

ROFFE, D.R. (Leicester): 'The manor in Domesday Book'—a project, funded by the Leverhulme Trust, concerning the diplomatic of Domesday Book and its relationship to tenurial structures; a reprint of *Rotuli Hundredorum* (Record Commission, 1812-18), and an edition of the unpublished Hundred Rolls.

ROOM, A. (Stamford): *The Brewer Dictionary of Names*, to be published by Cassell.

RUMBLE, A.R. (University of Manchester): ed., with D. HILL, *The Defence of Wessex: the Burghal Hidage and Anglo-Saxon Urbanization* (Manchester University Press—forthcoming).

II: ANTHROPONYMY

ROOM, A. (Stamford): a dictionary of first-names, to be published in the USA.

SMART, V. (University of St Andrews): compilation of a second Index, covering Vols XXI-XL, of the Sylloge of Coins of the British Isles, to contain (as did the previous Index) a comprehensive listing of all forms of personal names found on the relevant coins.

III: TOPONYMY

COATES, R. (University of Sussex): work on the place-names of Hayling and Thorney Islands in Chichester Harbour.

EVERITT, A. (*olim* University of Leicester): a paper on the historical significance of place-names in *-feld*.

FIELD, J. (Leicester): a book on field-names, commissioned by Longmans for their series 'Approaches to Local History'.

NICOLAISEN, W.F.H. (SUNY, Binghamton): a dictionary of Pictish place-names.

OWEN, Hywel Wyn (Y Coleg Normal, Bangor): (a) an English version of his book on place-name studies for schools in Wales (the original Welsh version has already been reprinted): (b) a popular book on the place-names of the Mold area of Clwyd, aimed at the National Eisteddfod held there in August 1991.

ROOM, A. (Stamford): a chapter on 'Place-names of England' for the forthcoming *Oxford Companion to the English Language*.

WAUGH, D. (Edinburgh): an article on the place-names of Stroma (evacuated in the 1950s), for a book edited by Donald Omand on various aspects of island life.
