
Database Mark 3

In the earlier databases (Mark 1 and Mark 2) the user interface was part of FoxPro and Access but for the current one (Mark 3) the user interface is the browser-based content management system, API and front-end and these were written in PHP / HTML / JavaScript.

Over the course of 2018 and 2019, Gilbert Márkus (assisted by other members of the project team) surveyed the place-names of seven historical parishes in Kirkcudbrightshire, making these names and explanations about their meaning and historical context available through this website. 

Scotland's landscape is rich in place-names incorporating names of saints (hagiotoponyms), mostly of medieval origin. These names, several thousands of them, span Scotland's historical linguistic range, including names in Northern British (Ecclesmachan), Gaelic (Kilmacolm, Tobermory), Norse (Barra) and Scots (St Quivox, Ladykirk). The project aimed to collect these hagiotoponyms, identify the saints commemorated in them, and present them in a public, searchable database.



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
